A mid-week word from Pastor Darren...

Dear Friends,

As one who has lived along the shores of the Gulf Coast for the majority of my life, I never cease to appreciate the lessons that come from the experience of "storm watch." The initial anticipation is one thing–causing different degrees of anxiety– but the experience of actual landfall is another story altogether.

When the damage is severe, we plead with God for mercy and strength. When the storm misses us, we often shout our thanks and praise. If the storm misses us, but then hits someone else, then we wonder about that too. Last week James reminded us that God does not play favorites, so how do we make sense of this?

Is God trying to tell us something? And if so, what? Or do we leave it simply to the local meteorologist to tell us 'what is up'?

This week's church newsletter is hardly the place to solve those ancient mysteries, but it is the place to invite us into a deeper reflection of where and how God is showing up in our lives. How inclined are we, really, to remain curious about these things? And where do you go to find quick and easy answers for those threats or challenges that appear just over the horizon? Do you have an app for that? Is it working?

I confess that I do not. In fact, I don't even want one. Such an individualistic solution is bound to have its limitations. I also recognize just how much I miss by relying only on that which I can hold in the palm of *my* hand.

As Psalm 19 declares, there is much to be said for looking up and out beyond the fragile grip of our control.

As Jerry Webber has expressed it,

The heavenlies speak to us: They tell us that God is beyond our religious imagination, and that God is beyond our most outrageous scientific thought. They tell us that God has not stopped creating the cosmos, nor is God finished creating God's human children.

I do love the idea of God's continuing work in creation. As if God were not done with us...as if there is more to be revealed in this relationship...as if we had reason to trust and hope in that which we do not yet see or understand...as if God might actually love us far more than we realized or were willing to admit.

I know, I know. Those are some big "If's." But if we pay attention, then I believe we will discover that Ashland Place UMC is a wonderful place to ask these very real questions of ourselves and God. I believe that you and I are meant to work on this together!

In the coming days and weeks, you will find more and more invitations for you to join in any number of spiritual conversations. Of course, having the information by itself will not change a thing. But when we choose where and how we intend to show up...it can make all the difference in the world.

This Sunday at 11:00


Under the guidance of our Children's Director, the children have been practicing during Sunday School for a special song that will be performed during the 11:00 service.
